Additional expenses such as private tuition or medical expenses may also be considered if it substantially reduces the yearly income. Step 3: Required Documentation-----

You must attach a signed statement explaining the circumstances, in addition to the following supporting documentation or it will not be processed:

- If unemployed:
 1. A copy of the unemployed person’s 2020 W-2 form(s) (and a federal tax return transcript will be required, if filed). If after 1/1/22, also provide copies of 2021 W-2’s.
 2. A letter from the former employer stating last date of employment and the total that was earned for the current calendar year (you may also provide a last pay stub as long as the dates match)
 3. A copy of the letter from the unemployment office showing eligible benefits.
 4. A copy of the unemployed person’s 2021 federal tax return transcript may be required or W-2 forms, if you are applying for a special circumstance for changes based on calendar years, 2021 or 2022.
- If divorce or death occurred:
 1. A copy of the divorced or deceased person’s 2020 W-2 form(s) (and a federal tax return transcript may be required)
 2. A copy of the divorce decree or death certificate
- If benefits such as child support has been lost:
 1. A copy of the 2020 W-2 form(s) (and a federal tax return transcript may be required), of the person who lost the benefits
 2. A statement from the agency that provided the benefit, stating the date the benefit expired and total received in 2021 and/or 2022
- If you paid for private child care and/or private elementary or secondary tuition **in excess of 3%** of your or your parent’s (if dependent) gross in 2020 or 2021 income:
 1. Copies of tuition statements for the corresponding 2020 or 2021 calendar year
 2. A copy of the 2020 or 2021 federal tax return transcript may be required
- If you paid medical expenses that will not be covered by insurance or itemized on your tax return, **in excess of 11%** of your or your parent’s (if dependent) gross 2020 or 2021 income:
 1. Copies of medical statements, showing payments made in 2020 or 2021, or copies of canceled checks used for payment.
 2. A copy of the person’s 2020 or 2021 federal tax return transcript may be required
- If your situation has not been identified, please submit the following:
 1. All applicable documentation regarding the situation
 2. 2020 or 2021 W-2 form(s) for the year benefits were lost (a federal tax return transcript may be required)
