**What is Advanced Placement (AP)<sup>®</sup>?**

AP or Advanced Placement is a term which describes high school courses of college-level that a student may complete during their junior and/or senior year of high school. Near the conclusion of the AP course, students may test their knowledge by completing an AP exam (created by the College Board). Officials with the College Board will then score the exam over the summer and send the results to the prospective institution the student has indicated in their application. The student may earn college credit and be eligible for advanced placement into specific courses depending on their score. *“Through AP’s college-level courses and exams, you can earn college credit and advanced placement, stand out in the admissions process, and learn from some of the most skilled, dedicated, and inspiring teachers in the world.”* -College Board Website ([www.collegeboard.com/ap](http://www.collegeboard.com/ap))

**AP Score Policy and Credit Granted:**

The AP score range is 1-5 for all exams, with the minimum passing score, established by AP, being a score of 3. Generally, students will earn 3 semester hours of credit for each exam on which they achieve a scaled score of 3 or above. **There are some exceptions where students may earn more than 3 hours depending on their score. Please see below for a detailed breakdown of the AP exams and hours awarded for each exam.**
