



Scholarships & Awards at CUC

All traditional undergraduate students admitted to CUC receive either a **merit scholarship** or **award**. Admitted students are also eligible for **need-based financial aid**, which includes federal loans (Stafford Loans), federal grants (Pell Grant) and state grants (Illinois MAP awards – for Illinois residents only).

Financial Aid Timeline for New **CUC** Students

NOTE! Be sure to file your FAFSA as soon as possible beginning **October 1** so that you may be awarded all the aid for which you are eligible.

For students enrolling at Concordia University Chicago for the fall semester:

SEPTEMBER - NOVEMBER

- Complete the admission process for acceptance to CUC.
- Secure any local scholarship forms and apply according to individual deadlines.
- Beginning **October 1**, your family may file the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) for the upcoming academic year. **Illinois students should file the FAFSA before December 1 to be considered for the MAP grant.**
- Apply for financial assistance by completing the FAFSA and submitting to the federal processor; log on to fafsa.gov to complete your FAFSA. List Concordia University Chicago as your college of choice. CUC's FAFSA school code is **001666**.

DECEMBER

- Receive notification of your financial aid eligibility and award letter.

JANUARY - APRIL

- Let CUC know of any scholarships or grant awards received from private sources.
- Sign and return your financial aid award letter as soon as possible.
- Send in enrollment and housing deposits to CUC.
- Sign up for a tuition payment plan** (interest-free monthly installments).

MAY

- May 1 - National Candidate Reply Deadline. Submit your enrollment deposit indicating your intent to enroll at CUC.
- Notify the Office of Financial Aid of any changes in your housing plans and/or family financial circumstances.

JUNE - JULY

- June 1 - Submit all required documents to complete your financial aid file.
- Attend a Jump Start orientation session at CUC and register for classes.
- Deadline to electronically sign and submit Direct Loan Master Promissory Notes and confirmation of Loan Entrance Counseling.
