

## about the conductor



DR. MAURICE C.
BOYER is professor
of music at
Concordia University
Chicago, where
he conducts the
chamber orchestra
and the chapel choir
(Schola Cantorum),

and teaches aural skills, music history and interdisciplinary courses in the honors curriculum. Dr. Boyer is music director of the American Kantorei of Saint Louis, MO, and is associate conductor of the Symphony of Oak Park and River Forest.

He has been artistic director of Aestas Consort and Heritage Chorale. Dr. Boyer has served as guest conductor for the Peoria Bach Festival, as well as assistant chorus master and guest chorus master with the Montreal Symphony Orchestra.

Although born in the United States,
Dr. Boyer began his musical training (piano, voice and solfège) in Aix-en-Provence,
France, where he lived until the age of 18.
He holds a Doctor of Musical Arts degree in orchestral conducting from the University of Maryland, College Park. His Master of Music is in choral conducting and his Bachelor of Music in sacred music (with

piano as his principal instrument). Both were earned at Westminster Choir College of Rider University in Princeton, NJ. His principal conducting teachers have been Joseph Flummerfelt, Kenneth Kiesler and James Ross. He also studied theology at Princeton Theological Seminary.

Among his areas of sustained interest and research are the intersection of music and theology, the sacred choral works of J. S. Bach—historical performance practice and theology—and the symphonic music of Mozart, Mahler and Sibelius.

## about the soloist



LORI BOYER is the director of choral and general music at Walther Christian Academy (Melrose Park, IL) where she has taught for nearly 20 years. Passionate about music education.

she is active as clinician and adjudicator for elementary, middle and high school choral and solo/ensemble festivals. From 2019–21, she served as assistant music director of Anima - Glen Ellyn Children's Chorus. She is a called worker in the Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod.

Mrs. Boyer holds degrees in voice performance (Valparaiso University) and

music education (Concordia University Chicago), and is pursuing a Master of Arts in music at Concordia University Chicago. An active freelancer in the Chicago area, she has sung professionally as a soloist and choir member with various ensembles in the Midwest, including Aestas Consort (Chicago), American Kantorei (St. Louis), St. Charles Singers and Light Opera Works (Evanston).

## about the organist



EMILY WOOCK is an instructor of music at Concordia University Chicago, where she teaches courses in both music education and church music. She also serves as Chapel

organist and teaches applied organ. In addition to her work at the University, she works part time as music director and organist at Redeemer Lutheran Church in Elmhurst, IL. She previously served churches and schools in Indiana. Trained first as an organist, she has performed throughout the United States and Germany.

Woock frequently serves as a presenter, facilitator, consultant and mentor for music educators. She holds a BA from Concordia University Chicago, a Master of Sacred Music from the University of Notre Dame and a Master of Music Education from Anderson University. She completed her

Kodály certification at the Hartt School of Music, where she studied with master teacher John Feierabend, and has since been in demand to teach professional development certification courses through the Feierabend Association for Music Education (FAME). She currently serves as treasurer on the FAME national board. Woock is in the dissertation phase of her PhD in music education from Indiana University in Bloomington, IN.
