Molly Miklosz BA '19

This month, we are excited to spotlight Molly Miklosz BA '19, an alumna whose vocational journey shows deep commitment to creativity and community. From her time in the art department at **Concordia** to her recent art residency in France, Molly continues to Stand Tall for excellence as both an art teacher and independent artist in Chicago.

Molly's love for art began early, fueled by the inspiration she received from her teachers.

"From the start, I knew that I wanted to pursue art...I feel like it's, in a sense, a way of giving back because my teachers have done so much for me, with my creativity and fostering a passion in me to keep creating. I wanted to do that for other people. Teaching art lent itself well to that sense of giving back."

At Concordia, Molly's experience was shaped by a supportive community that helped her flourish. She ran track and cross country all four years and worked closely with the Art Department as an assistant.

"So much of my story is tied to the running community that I found at CUC. I was also one of the art department assistants for four years, so I got to know the professors well. We bonded and had a great relationship. It was nice to have these different niches which made me feel like I was at my home away from home."

In July 2024, Molly's artistic journey took a transformative turn when she was accepted into a two-week artist residency at The Chateau Orquevaux in France. This experience was a dream come true and positively impacted her confidence and artistic vision.

"France felt like a dream," Molly recalls. "The biggest takeaway I received was probably the growth of confidence in myself. I saw this side of myself that I had never seen before, this Molly that could navigate Europe by herself, be self-sufficient, and also be efficient as an artist. It made me realize that my work is something people truly enjoy."

The confidence she built during the residency, combined with the time spent focusing on her art, led to a deepened sense of purpose. "Coming off of this amazing experience, I would love to have my art play a much more significant role in my life," she reflects. "It wasn't something I had fully considered before."

Upon returning to the United States, Molly resumes her role as a high school art teacher in Chicago with a renewed sense of mission.

"My students can be perfectionists in a lot of ways. I think learning that it's okay to make bad things because it only makes you better is important... I also teach in the city, and we're so close to Millennium Park and all these other amazing outdoor spaces. I want to incorporate more Plein air work into my classes. Nature was such a big component of my residency in France and why it was so peaceful, and I feel like Chicago's youth need that right now."

Molly's journey is a wonderful example of how Concordia alumni **<u>Stand</u>** Tall for their passions and pursue excellence. The foundation laid at Concordia continues to inspire Molly to cultivate creativity in others, making a lasting impact in her community and beyond.
