Frequently Asked Questions

How much do tickets cost, and how many tickets can I purchase?

The purchase price of a Golden Ticket is \$100 per entry. Payments are not tax-deductible contributions. If a purchase is dishonored by the bank, the entry will be declared invalid. There is no limit to the number of entries an individual may purchase. No other purchase is necessary when buying drawing entries.

What are my odds of winning? What happens if I do not win?

A minimum of 100 tickets will be sold. Odds of winning the prize depends on the number of drawing tickets ultimately sold.

What happens if 100 tickets are not sold before the scheduled drawing?

Tickets will be sold until 6:00 p.m. CT on Saturday, September 26. If 100 tickets have not been sold by 6:00 pm, sales will continue until 8:00 pm CT. If 100 tickets have not been sold by 8:00 pm CT the drawing will be cancelled. Golden Ticket purchasers will be offered the opportunity to donate monies to CUC scholarships or request a refund. Donated refunds become a tax deductible gift.

How will I know if I won? Do I have to be present at the event to win?

The winner will be selected through a random drawing September 26, 2020 and announced during the Maroon & Gold livestream broadcast. Entrants need not be present to win. The winner of the drawing will be notified according to the contact information provided to Concordia University Chicago Foundation at the time of entry.

Can I give the winning entry to someone else?

Entries must be purchased by single individual. If more than one name is stated on an entry, the first name listed shall be deemed the entrant and subsequent names will be disregarded. It is the sole responsibility of the participants in a group entry to allocate the prize among members of the group. The right to take possession of the Golden Ticket offering through the winning entry is neither assignable nor transferable.

How does the winner claim the prize? What happens if the prize is not claimed?

The prize is provided via digital communication. The winning Golden Ticket holder will be contacted by phone and email to confirm preferred receipt. In the event a winner cannot be contacted, fails to respond within seven (7) calendar days, fails to otherwise qualify for the prize and/or declines the prize, an alternate winner will be selected. If the prize is not claimed by the winner within seven (7) calendar days, the winner will forfeit any rights to the Golden Ticket offering and all rights and privileges. An alternate winner will then be drawn and the procedures above will be followed until the prize is claimed.

What happens if the Golden Ticket Drawing is cancelled?

If for any reason the Golden Ticket Drawing is cancelled, Concordia University Chicago Foundation will either:

- Obtain permission from Golden Ticket purchasers to re-direct their entry monies as a donation to CUC scholarships. Donations made in this manner become tax deductible. OR
- Reimburse each Golden Ticket purchaser within 60 days of the drawing cancellation.

What happens if the Golden Ticket Drawing goes wrong?

Concordia University Chicago Foundation reserves the right to cancel, suspend and/or modify the drawing, or any part of it, if any fraud, technical failures or any other factor beyond Concordia University Chicago Foundation's reasonable control impairs the integrity or proper functioning of the drawing, as determined by Concordia University Chicago Foundation in its sole discretion.

Who has the final say in matters concerning the drawing?

The decision of Concordia University Chicago Foundation shall be final on all matters concerning the drawing. Concordia University Chicago Foundation reserves the right, in its sole discretion, to disqualify any individual it finds to be tampering with the drawing process or to be acting in violation of the official rules or any other promotion or in an unsportsmanlike or disruptive manner.
